2.	Police Scotland Update: A new Police Inspector has been appointed to the	
	Forres Area, Inspector Grant McCutcheon, who will take up duty in the last	
	week of February. During the period 18 th January to 13 th February there have	
	been 24 detected crimes within the FCC area. Motoring: Male,32, and	
	male,25, charged with being over the prescribed limit for alcohol. Theft: Male,	
	28, charged with three shoplifting offences. Anti social Behaviour: Male,18,	
	charged and reported to the Fiscal, for vandalising a car on Grant Drive;	
	Female, 29, Charged and appeared at court for threatening behaviour and	
	possession of a knife; Male, 25, charged with using threatening and abusive	
	behaviour following a disturbance on Castlehill Road. Drugs: Male, 51, found	
	in possession of Cannabis at Hainings North.	
	Motability Scooters: Sgt Brander advised that scooters should be on the	
	pavement but if there is an issue about due consideration for pedestrians, this	
	should be reported and advice will be given. M. Walker asked about using	
	scooter whilst under the influence of alcohol and was told that any breaches of	
	the law will be addressed. J. Guthrie reported that a scooter without lights and	
	the hood up had been seen near the by pass. Sgt Brander asked that this type	
	of incident be reported. Speed of Traffic on High Street in the evenings: G.	
	Hilditch had reported a driver jumping the lights. J. Guthrie pointed out that	
	when a pedestrian presses the button the lights immediately change giving	
	inadequate warning to drivers. Sgt Brander will find out about about having the	
	timing adjusted. Police Scotland has a high visibility presence at week ends.	
	There is a focus on drivers at Tesco. A warning is given and if there is any	
	repetition the vehicle may be taken away and there is a cost incurred by the	
	driver for recovery.	
3.	Public Session: A request was submitted by Forres in Bloom to make a	
	presentation to FCC about the work of the group.	
4.	Presentation by Robert Grant, Kenny Shand and Mark Hamilton of Springfield	
	Properties about Forres R3 Ferrylea Phase 2 housing development. There will	

be a public consultation in the Community Centre on March 3rd from 2pm to 8pm. The development will include affordable housing. S.Ferris asked if there would be a visual impact from the houses at the top of the ridge and was assured that these will be on flatter ground and will not impinge. M. Walker asked about Developer's Contribution. A process is being developed with TMC to allow provision for Education, Community and Facilities. In Phase 1 the Dental Surgery and Retail units are provided. M. Walker expressed concern that Forres may become a dormitory town and that facilities will be required for an increased population. G. Hilditch asked if Mannachie Road will be widened and is concerned that the road will become a rat run from the Dallas Dhu area. Road improvements will be made. E. Hayward asked when Traffic Lights will be installed at the St Catherine's Road junction and was assured that this is a key issue. MOTP asked if TMC has received the required funding and was informed that funding has been given. J. Guthrie asked when will Affordable Housing be available and was informed that it is included in Stage 1. G. Murdoch asked about drainage from the site. E. Hayward said that there is a document on TMC website and an answer to Scottish Water is awaited from TMC. The developer is working with Scottish water and there will be SUDS provision on the site. MOTP asked about the lack of a pavement on part of Grantown Road between the two roundabouts. Cllr Alexander said that the developer will complete the pavement provision.

- Co-option of Councillors: Samantha Fraser was proposed by J. Guthrie and seconded by S. Ferris. E Hayward abstained. Keir Hardie was proposed by E. Hayward and seconded by M.Walker. E. Hayward will provide the appropriate documents. Co-opted members of FCC are not permitted to vote for 12 months. One vacancy remins.

Traffic Lights at Health Centre: A fault had been reported on 19th January. The red push button was found to be frozen. A repair was made by 4.30pm on the same day. H. Shaw said that there is hardly enough time to exit from Mannachie and motorists are jumping the lights. There are also long tailbacks at busy times. M. Walker said that the sensor does not appear to be working and motorists are having to wait at quiet times when there is no other traffic on the

	road. E. Hayward will report that the sensor is not working.

8.	Moray Councillors' Reports:	
	Cllr Alexander: The report on the Sustainability of Forres Schools is	
	completed but will not be made public. TMC Budget :The money allocated to	
	Moray Towns Partnership will not be affected; School Meals will be increased	
	by 5%; Instrumental Instruction will be increased by 20%. Tenants Forum :	
	Forres residents reported that they are happy with their homes. Fire Service;	
	Thirty people attended an Open Night at Forres Fire Station. Recruits are	
	needed to maintain the service and some of those attending had expressed	
	interest. Asset Management Briefing: The 10 year Capital Plan is	
	oversubscribed. The School Estate requires major maintenance. The Future	
	Schools decision means there will be no closures Cllr Alexander feels that it	
	would be better to abandon and amalgamate to avoid huge expenditure.	
	Car Parking: J. Guthrie mentioned that there are 2 spaces reserved for Car	
	Share use but cars are parked badly and causing a nuisance. Clir Creswell:	
	Health and Social Care – the Integrated Joint Board will be launched on 1st	
	April. Forres and Fochabers will be designated Dementia Friendly Towns.	
	Network Rail Information evening – the event was well attended. Requests for	
	additional parking are being considered. High Street Shops: Concerns were	
	expressed about the number of empty shops on High Street and what could be	
	done to attract businesses. Cllr Creswell offered to send information about	
	Business Rates relief to E. Hayward to be circulated.

	Former garage on Victoria Road: Change of use to Jet Wash – E. Hayward	
	will circulate planning application.	
	Hanover Court: Construction appears to be ahead of schedule.	
	G.Hilditch asked if there are plans for the derelict building on Hepworth Lane.	
	E. Hayward will make enquiries.	
10.	Chair's Report:	
	S. Noble reported that he had shown the FCC promotional power point to the	
	Rotary Club of Forres and that it had been well received. The Power Point is	
	available for all FCC members to use with local groups. S.Ferris commented	
	that there is still some fine tuning to do.

	a) The new play equipment should be in place by mid March. E. Hayward	EH

	hire of premises; £29.00 to Royal British Legion for Poppy Wreath and

	a) S. Ferris: Forres Highland Games now has Charity Status. Forres	
	Community Garden: there are 2 plots available at a cost of £50 per	
	annum. Space in the poly tunnel costs £10.00 per annum. Enquiries to	
	S. Ferris.	
	b) J. Guthrie attended a presentation about Altzheimers which was very	
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	informative. He also attended the network Rail meeting.	
	c) G. Murdoch reported that Forres Features which will oversee the	
	Cluny Woods Lights project is now a Community Interest Company. A	
	Committee has been formed: G. Alexander; J. Duncan; G Hilditch; S.	
	MacIver; E. Tomkinson; J.King; M. Drummond; B and L Budge. E.	
	Hayward had received questions about noise. G. Murdoch replied that	
	the event will comply with regulations. JCC meeting: A.Kennedy	
	proposed that a Complaints Procedure be added to the CC Handbook.	
	Jane Martin will prepare a draft for consideration.	
	d) C. Rodger asked if FCC is willing to sponsor a meeting about the	
	possibility of growing vegetables in a High Street location with a	
	speaker from Todmorten Incredible Edibles. The meeting will be in the	
	Town Hall on 18 th May. S. Noble replied that FCC is not in a position to	
	do so and suggested that an approach be made to FAF.	
	e) G. Hilditch: The Berry Burn Trust will meet to decide disbursements to	
	local groups. Information is available on the website.	
	f) M. Walker: The Sports Hub has a new development worker and is	
	seeking Charity Status.	
	g) S. Ferris will be away from Forres for the next 3 months. He does not	
	have the same connection with Scouting and asked that his remit be	
	changed. S. Noble asked that a review of roles be an Agenda Item for	
	the March meeting.	
14.	Health Centre Concerns: S. Noble had received a complaint from a MOTP	
	that he had tried to get an appointment, had phoned 15 times within 7 minutes	
	and the cost of the calls was £5.52. Cllr Alexander advised that it is better to	
	leave time between calls. It is also possible to go in to the centre and be seen	
	without an appointment.
