Minute of regular meeting held at Burghead Harbour Office on Thursday 4th August 2016

The Chair opened the meeting at 7.30

The following police report had been provided beforehand. The police were not present at the meeting.

1. LOCAL INTEREST INFORMATION

During the period from 3 June to 4 August 2016, there have been 6 reported crimes within the Community Council area. The following is a synopsis of some of the crimes that have been detected.

In June, an 18 year old male was charged and reported in relation to an Assault and Vandalism which occurred at an address in Cummingston. The male was arrested and put to court the following day.

Throughout July officers from the Community Policing Team have been carrying out speed checks along the B9040. On 21 July a vehicle was detected being driven in excess of the 30 mph limit. The driver failed to stop for Police however has been identified and enquiries are ongoing to trace the individual.

Matters arising from previous minutes

Maltings Fencing

The meeting noted that work on the east side is complete, but that the makeup of the fencing on the north elevation along the backshore was still unclear.

Community Garden

The AGM of the Community Garden was held on 28th July. Attendance was good, and there are new committee members and enthusiasm for next steps.

ANY OTHER COMPETENT BUSINESS

Marchhead Cottage Cummingston

BCCC had lodged objections to the planning application to demolish the existing cottage and to build two semidetached houses on the site, but planning permission has been granted.

Giant hogweed. The presence of giant hogweed was reported to the Lands and Parks department in the Council. BCCC wish to thank the department as the issue was dealt with the next day.

A letter has been received about Dunbar Lane being overgrown. This will be followed up with the Lands and Parks department.

It was noted that there is a poor pavement surface on the corner outside the Post Office, and falls have been reported. Billy will phone the Roads department, and Councillor Tuke will follow up.

Cars and old windows were removed from a lane in a case of fly tipping.

Concern was expressed about obstruction of the road around the Bowls Club recently during a match. Car owners are requested to park responsible and park further away where the roads aren't blocked.

Burghead in Bloom were pleased to report that the Kipper BBQ made about ± 1650 .

School closures are reported to be possible by the press. Councillor Tuke stated that there are no plans to close schools and that there is a moratorium on closures for the next three years (although moratoriums can be overturned). There was then a discussion on the poor state of Moray school buildings.

Being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting closed at 9pm
