1.	Chair S Noble opened the meeting and apologies were noted. He welcomed	
	the two newly co-opted members Cllr Shaun Moat and Cllr Kenny Shand.	
2.	Police Scotland Update: There was no Police presence or report submitted	
3.	Public Session:	
	I. The Chair welcomed Sandra MacLennan of Forres in Bloom. Mrs	
	MacLennan proudly showed the trophy and certificates won by Forres	
	in the "Keep Scotland Beautiful" awards. The town scooped a gold	
	medal and was also named the overall winner in the "Medium Town	
	Category. The committee applauded the group's achievements.	
	II. Joe Pirnie and Adrian Hutchins spoke to the meeting about their wish to	
	employ a Community Warden in Forres. In addition to vandalism	
	there was a continuous problem with litter and the two thought that	
	having a Community Warden could go some way to eradicate the	
	problem. The current Community Warden covers a large area in Moray	
	and cannot dedicate time to one area alone. It was recognised that	
	such a position would need to work alongside the Police and that there	
	could be difficulties given the current situation with Police Scotland.	
	There would also need to be an employer in place. The meeting	
	wished the two well in their efforts but could not support the proposed	
	scheme in its current format. It was agreed that Eleanor would write a	
	letter to Community Wardens asking for a more visible presence in	
	Forres	EH
	III. David Sim, President, Forres Rotary Club gave an insight into the	
	work of Rotary Clubs. The ethos of Rotary clubs and members was to	
	serve the local community by extending the hand of friendship and by	
	pooling resources, skills and talents for the benefit of the community.	
	There are currently around 40 members who get involved with the more	
	well - known activities of the Rotary Club - The bonfire night, Santa's	
	sleigh at Christmas and the Children in Need quiz. They coordinated	
	responses to disasters and work with Shelter to deliver much needed	
	boxes to affected areas. He spoke also of other areas where the Rotary	

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	are involved and new initiatives that they are currently working on like the promotion of a newsletter. The Chair thanked Mr Sim for his interesting and comprehensive insight into the work of the Rotary Club.
