Welcome Police Report Community Warden report	<ul> <li>The Chair opened the meeting at 1900hrs after welcoming all those attending.</li> <li>The Police were unable to attend.</li> <li>Tim Betts (Community Warden) was unable to attend however a report was produced and discussed at the meeting; <ul> <li>Abandoned vehicles - eight vehicles have been investigated. Enquiries are currently ongoing into two of these, the rest have been removed by their registered keepers.</li> <li>Anti-social behaviour – causes to be targeted with Police Scotland and other partners.</li> <li>Dog fouling – three complaints were received this period; patrols have been undertaken, leaflets delivered and posters installed. Urge people who witness dog fouling to report it on 0700 670 665.</li> <li>Litter – concerns have been raised about litter from Lossiemouth High School pupils around the Co-op and Faroes Court/Boyd Anderson Drive area. The school has been made aware and are monitoring the area as well as litter patrols being conducted over lunch times.</li> <li>Neighbour disputes – a number of neighbour disputes have been investigated, with a wide range of advice given and mediation provided.</li> <li>Seagulls – two complaints were received with advice being given as to why the council encourage people not to feed the gulls. We continue to advise people not to feed seagulls as the noise, mess and swooping behaviour of the gulls can cause distress and nuisance to the neighbours.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>			
2. Local Community Attendees	<ul> <li>Yvonne Murray is organising a 'Red Rocks Fundraising Event' in Lossiemouth on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2016 to raise funds for the 'Sand Piper Trust'. This</li> </ul>			

		is to allow defibrillators to be purchased and place around the town. The cost of a defibrillator and cabinet is in the region of £1500. These units could be placed in areas that have CCTV or outside the Police Station, Co-op, Post Office or Library. The idea would be to train enough people to use these machines. Mike Mullholland was keen to provide support to Yvonne and would also take this to 'The Trust' to allow them to take part. Councillor Chris Tuke suggested that the positioning of these units could be placed on our Town Map next time they are printed.
