

Amendment 2018.1 - Revised safety inspection frequencies

Moray Council are currently working on the phased implementation of a risk-based methodology for safety inspections, as recommended with the 'Well Managed Highway Infrastructure' Code of Practice.

As part of the above work Moray Council has reviewed it's network hierarchy, and has also decided to adopt the safety inspection frequencies which are recommended by SCOTS (the Society of Chief Transportation Officers in Scotland) with effect from 1st November 2018.

The revised inspection frequencies are detailed in the tables below, alongside the old frequencies for comparison. The tables below supercede Tables 4.1 in both the Carriageway Lifecycle Plan (page 16) and the Footway Lifecycle Plan (page 15).
