1.5. WELCOME

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting and remarked at the low turnout from members.

1.6. Police Report

Jamie Day is the community Police Officer carrying out pop up Police service in libraries, supermarkets and schools. Rachel Deveney of Police Scotland outlined how he had been working with schools and communities recently.

The search for a missing person in Lossiemouth highlighted the Police use of drones and social media.

There were a number of attempted break-ins in Elgin.

Parking at schools has been addressed particularly at St Sylvesters where an education approach was taken. Parking in the High Street around Marks and Spencers was also tackled using a ticketing approach but it was thought to be not effective.

1.7. New Elgin LOIP

Laura Cameron and Sylvia Jamieson gave an update on the New Elgin LOIP work that has been going on. Issues tackled in the area include parking, seagulls and unemployment. Sylvia and Laura went in to some detail about how these initiatives were progressing with support from the community, the Council, Police Scotland and employers.

There was a discussion about the seagull reduction and the effect on other areas of town. Cllr Graham Leadbitter gave an update on the proposed expansion of the scheme across Elgin giving some sight of the end of the problem. The Moray College annexe is a source of concern and roosting seagulls.

A community garden is being created with help from REAP including areas for herbs, vegetables and soft fruit. It was noted that Paul Briggs had been involved in the LOIP activities.

Working with Ashgrove and New Elgin Public Hall and the Elgin and District Men's Shed will create a hub and place for repairing and knowledge sharing.

A fete will be hosted in the Dovecot Park on 16th August 2020 and the Community Council and others are invited to take a stand to show their support for the event.
