Item	Discussion	Action
1.	Welcome and apologies: Chair welcomed everyone. Apologies were recorded as above and the Chair welcomed the members of the public and Shaun Moat who had been invited to give an update on the Skate park	
2.	Community Safety Report: Insp McCullie summarised CSP 56.	
	Community engagement in Forres and by the regional team had been gearing up for festive season, but it is likely that the latest covid restrictions will reduce the impact.	
	Youth annoyance is still a feature. In response to a question raised at last month's meeting only one report of criminality was recorded but the average rate of calls was 16/month. However, this figure should be treated with caution as there might be multiple calls relating to the same incident.	
	FCC had received an email from the office of Ariane Burgess, MSP regarding a Forres resident experiencing issues with youth annoyance. This is the same issue that had been reported directly to Cllr Alexander and FCC by the person. FCC does not have the resources to support installation of CCTV which is a MC responsibility. Insp McCullie thinks that police have had an involvement and JL will forward details of previous correspondence to confirm.	JL
3.	Public Session	
	Update on Skate Park Initiative – Shaun Moat	
	A feasibility study was completed in May. There were 702 online survey responses. Four locations were identified as possible sites for the skate park: Bogton Road, Roys Road	
	Mannachie and Grant Park. 92 % of respondents were in favour of the park. Cllr Alexander,	
	Cllr Cresswell, Chief Inspector Stevenson and Douglas Ross have all supported the	

proposal. At the recent AGM concern was raised on the scoring used in the report. Following a review 45% were in favour of Grant Park which is the preferred option. The group are now in discussion with MC and a site visit took place last week with another planned before Christmas. Funding required is £0.75 million.

Questions

SF asked where in Grant Park the park would be sited. *SM* – *the area where the Showies are normally situated has been identified by MC as the best location.*

Sandra Maclennan: Due to technical issues Sandra's question will be relayed via email after the meeting

DP asked how long the project would take. SM – we hope to have planning permission by spring 2022 and finished by 2023.

6. Chair's Report

- Recently had the privilege of sitting on Auchernack Trust decision panel and can attest to amount of work that goes into making decisions.
- Catch up with Insp McCullie and briefing on how policing works locally. Calls are triaged when they come in. Locally the police are stretched for capacity and resource.
- JL and Chair had met with BH and CL to discuss the common good fund. An email has been sent to MC to ask for a regular breakdown of the common good accounts.
- TTF CAT of Bogton Road. The FCC submission has been returned and promoted through Facebook with links to the consultation on MC website and to our minutes. At the Green Spaces meeting TTF stated that they had requested a delay on the CAT to allow time for an HIE funded report on the monetarised social benefit. Still awaiting confirmation on whether consultation is only for Royal Burgh residents. TTF happy to hold a meeting in the new year to update on the CAT.
- Green spaces meeting highlighted collaboration on Queens Jubilee.
- Laura Cameron and Anne Rossiter are to progress permissions for the outdoor gym and advise when the Mannachie consultation is due to begin.
- Application for trees successful so decision needed on where they will go. James Hunter from MC will help with this process.
- Met with St Leonards Road speeding group and Elaine Penny (MC) to discuss traffic volume and speeding. Agreed to a site meeting in the new year.
- JCC online meeting covered the learning estate consultation. In 2014/15 a moratorium was placed on new build for 5 years. Forres Academy is in stage 3 of applications and consultation is ongoing with stakeholders. The earliest anticipated completion is likely to be 2027-28. However, this may change following council elections in May 2022.
- Payment for election leaflets is to be carried forward to next JCC meeting.
- All permissions are in place for the Hogmanay procession. Due to Omnicron discussions are taking place on whether to proceed. The current opinion is that it

	probably won't go ahead but a decision will be made by 23 rd December dependent on the issue of guidance. If no further guidance the final deadline for a decision will be 29 th December.	
	Questions/comment Garry commented that it would be useful to see minutes from the Green Spaces Group. GM stated that some groups felt uncomfortable if the press were involved. Any points of interest are brought to FCC meeting. It was acknowledged that Garry did not report items he was asked not to.	
	Debra Duke, new CCLO gave a short introduction to her role.	
7.	 Correspondence Claire Filer on behalf of Ariane Burgess MSP regarding ASB and CCTV Letter of support for Nick Molnar's Berry Burn Application for Forres Friends of Woods and Fields 	
8.	Treasurer's Report Balance in the bank is £915.77 and a payment for E21.92 had been made for Hogmanay licence.	
9.	Community Councillor Group and Representatives Reports SF: Had researched resilience committee but couldn't find anything of significance on MC website apart from a report/booklet from 2016 on how resilience works in a small community. Debra commented that draft documents were presented to JCC in November, and she would send on this information. Jim Patterson is happy to brief CC's on the process and an invite will be sent to Jim in the new year.	JL
	DP: had been attending various groups that had restarted. Local items of note: TSB has closed so Bank of Scotland the only branch in the High Street. Royal Bank of Scotland mobile is in Forres on Tues mornings and Thursday afternoons. DP asked councillors about Orchard Road traffic lights and if MC are supporting pop up shops in Forres. The Old Pedigree garage has been bought and will offer start up units for rent. Cllr Alexander responded re Orchard Road traffic lights. Work will start before end of financial year. Garry asked if there had been any take up with any empty shops in High Street. Cllr Creswell thought this was unlikely as the one month allowed by MC was not long enough for projects to get up and running.	
	BH: Passed on Colin's apologies as he is unwell but is improving.	
	JI: Had received a call to supply generators and heaters to Cathay Nursing Home during the storm. He managed to supply a big generator and organised heaters. It was 2 or 3 days before the home was reconnected and surprising there is no back up on site considering it's for older folk. Keeping an eye on flooding - Applegrove field continually floods. Suggested a meeting in the new year to discuss town drainage. The Scottish Water had delayed the November meeting to the new year.	
	GM: Green spaces meeting. Mountain bike group's plans for several tracks on the far side of Cluny are progressing well. Pre-application request sent to MC planning for comment. MC Officers and sports hub (Anne Rossiter) have been very supportive. Sports Hub will sit above the bike group. Paths on Cluny Hill still need to be completed but this should be done by start of the year. If not completed by the end of February then contract will be terminated.	
	Martin Robertson is the new Forres CSO replacing Sylvia Jamieson	

JL – reported on Kenny's update on dropped kerbs. Grantown Park crossing is now level on both side with thanks to Moray council workmen. Some going in at Mannachie Rise. Bear Scotland have never done anything with the Lidl roundabout drop curbs or the junction at the Mundole road, the path goes all the way out there but there's a huge curb to get over. **Moray Councillors' Reports** 10. Cllr Creswell – Dyke CC had declared results and will convene soon. Dealing with a few homeless cases which is difficult due to availability of premises. Still supporting people with form filling. There will be some money available in January for people to apply for. Some will be issued automatically, some will be for groups to distribute to those in hardship. A few people are struggling with zero hours contracts. Attended a brief on illegal money lending. Film nights will continue this week with guidance from FACT. Interested in sports hub being an administrator for the bike group as this model could be used by other groups who need help. Cllr Alexander – Attended several briefings including on code of conduct which initiated discussion on whether addresses should be available to the public. Busy with Christmas lights and the Tolbooth. Entering period of budget setting. Pushing to get some school crossing patrollers re-instated, particularly in Kinloss, and investment in CCTV throughout Moray which is so dated it can't be repaired and needs replacing. Also requested people should make their Councillor the first point for issues such as CCTV rather than going to the press. SF: wondered if there was chance of getting traffic wardens back in Moray. Highland have a mobile team that cover an area rather than just one town and could this model be used in Moray? This could be suggested but priorities determine budget spend. Chair – from recent Parents Association the large water ingress, boiler breakdown and recruitment of maths teachers were causing concern. First online parents evening was successful. Cllr Alexander has written to MC following the huge expenditure on the Academy roof to find out why it's been leaking. Part of the issue is gull nesting material washing off into downpipes and blocking them. The staff issue is being exacerbated by positive covid tests and staff having to isolate and there not being enough supply teachers to cover. **Forthcoming Events** 11. Hogmanay 12.
