Welcome:

MR welcomed everyone and introduced Graeme Laing, Arancha Arnal and George Mckenzie who were in attendance to deliver a presentation on Edrington's proposal for New Maturation Warehousing, FSDU, Wetlands, SUDS Pond, Tree Nursery and associated roads and services at Ardcanny Farm, Rothes.

This is a greenfield site with the majority of land falling under category 4.1 (land capable of producing a narrow range of crops), the eastern part is classified as 3.1 (land capable of producing consistently high yields of a narrow range of crops – prime agricultural land) whilst further areas within the proposed site are classified as 5.2 (improved grassland).

During the following discussion a number of issues were raised:

Traffic – The A941 through Rothes is already extremely busy and is
often congested with large lorries trying to get through the town. It
was felt that more lorries travelling through Rothes as a result of this,
and other proposed planning applications, if approved, would be
totally unacceptable.

It was suggested that a By-Pass should be an option.

This proposal will result in 2 lorries, with casks, per day. However, as there is no construction plan yet, it is uncertain how many lorry journeys the construction phase would create.

- Footpaths residents expressed concerns regarding the loss/alteration of traditionally used footpaths. Questions were asked as to who would maintain and improve the paths.
 It was stated that the site would be fenced off, incrementally, as each phase of the development was started. The farmhouse would be demolished.
- Industrialisation of Rothes It was suggested that the warehousing should be built in the Central Belt, close to Edrington's bottling plant. The meeting was informed that there were no suitable brownfield sites.

Some people felt that Rothes was becoming over industrialised, that this proposal was far too big for the town and that it would ruin the scenic qualities of the area.

- Visualisations should reflect, accurately, what will be seen.
- Trees and shrubs should be more mature than saplings.

The meeting was informed that a full Environmental Impact Assessment would be included in the Planning Application.

MR thanked the 3 Presenters for their input and they left the meeting.
