4. Council: No Councillors present to report.

6. Minutes of Last Meeting (5.4.2023). One Amendment (# 11c> Ref. hosting meeting on Flood Prevention,: reworded.) Proposed: P.Fitch, Seconded: T. Christie. (Unanimous).dukedeb
7. Matters Arising from #6:
 - a) Leylandie Trees on Essil Road - Felling and Trimming to be authorised by CES. (Andy Wakely-tree Surgeons)
8. There are reports of regular occasions of speeding on Essil Road between Newton and Garmouth.
9. Treasurer's Report: The balance sheet will be available shortly, there is a balance of £2046 in the BoS Account. A donation of £90.00 was proposed and accepted as a suitable donation to G & K Golf Club, for their allowing us to use the club house for meetings.
10. Milltown - Defer to next Meeting.
11. Mosstodloch: Defer to next Meeting
12. The Chair reported that a new line of pylons will cross the ICC and LennoxCC areas to carry power from the new sustainable fields. This will include Brownmuir, Dipple, Ordiquish. It is to be noted that the pylons are 1/3 taller than existing ones, and the base is 1/3 greater in area. Scottish Power can use compulsory purchase powers as it is an essential utility,. The ICC as a whole asked if there should be community benefit resulting in the above project, as Moray has some of the highest unit charges in the UK, and this proposed line will carrying power to be sold cheaper elsewhere,. All were concerned that the Telephone signal mast, and Television Receiver aerial will be in close proximity to the line, and would this affect their performance?
13. AOCB: 1) It is understood that James Jones and Sons, Mosstodloch have recently been checked for noise pollution, after complaints from the Community.

2) Extreme concern has been expressed to Members of ICC about the appalling instances of parking in Mosstodloch when the school closes in the afternoon. Cars are partially blocking the Garmouth Rod, overflowing the Filling Station area, and 'abandoned' in the old Rothes road. There is a serious issue for road safety, and child awareness, particularly since the Moray Council failed in it's duty of care by removing the School crossing attendant, without any viable alternative. Issue to be made known to Councillors.
