● This is one of eight projects under the Moray Growth Deal
• They have reviewed what was in the original case and updated it accordingly and are
working towards a full business case
● This project will be delivered in phases, first being the renovation of the Elgin Town
Hall
O Next will be the redevelopment of the Grant Lodge
O There are hopes to develop the spaces in between
• Aiming to make a better experience for people in the town centre and those who visit
• It will be a long process but it has the potential to make a very big difference
• Main focuses of the redevelopment of the Elgin Town Hall:
O Enhancing the acoustics
■ They want to enhance the feeling of being in an auditorium

■ The biggest proposal is an acoustically separated studio

- Generating more income
 Want to build in the ability for more improvements just in case th
- Want to build in the ability for more improvements just in case there could be future funding
- There is a design workshop on the 10th of April for a stage two report
- The auditorium is the most important aspect of this plan, supper rooms and such are functional as is
- Planning priorities include future fitting, due to climate change concerns, there would be too many carbon emissions to demolish the building and rebuild
- Investors are likely to be interested in the Elgin Town Hall
- £15 million in construction costs for the Elgin Town Hall
- O Fully fund phase one whilst phase two is in development
- O Phase two will take a lot of time
- O Will raise the shortfall for Grant Lodge if possible
- Has the potential for heritage funding
- The second phase of the plan is to bring Grant Lodge back to use
- They're currently working with business consultants to create an operation model
- The library is a part of a different growth project, Early Years STEM project, with a STEM space planned within it

- The quarry being build will have to potential to affect the Elgin community and it is within the Moray boundaries
- The quarry will be extracting 1.1 million tonnes of sand and gravel over the course of
 18 years

\bigcirc 10 years assessment for sand and gravel was based on a supply and
demand estimate although it is difficult to quantify.
● There is also a cement plant planned that will generate ready mix cement
\bigcirc This will create more footfall: 18 lorries for the quarry and then private parties
who will be getting the cement
ullet The group were objecting to the noise, the lights, the dust dispersal, and the lorry
movements
 Lots of concern placed on the lorry movements
O Seems to be no upper limit on their movements
O Using rural roads is a safety concern
\bigcirc Road traffic survey could be inaccurate at the present time, the Springfield
houses are still being built so would not be taken into account
O Road improvements is not enough to get rid of their complaints
ullet The councillors should be able to launch an objection at the final planning phase
• It was stated at one point the Elgin Community Council was one of the consultees
ullet They have been told that the dust that would be dispersed is negligible however it
could be disruptive to the roads
● The quarry is in the pre-planning stage
O Aims to be ready for next summer however no hard deadline has been set
