Elgin Town Board
● Ian Findlay Path Fund
○£1.68 million, third year
○ Gives an opportunity to improve Elgin's paths
O Possible to partner up with someone
■ Alistar to contact relevant groups/people
Parking
 Seems to be getting better on the highstreet
O Batchen Street comes and goes
Police have issued over 400 tickets so far
○ The £10,000 has made a huge difference
● Parking on the pavement on certain streets was allowed if parking on the road
caused obstruction
• Lack of parking has the potential to affect contactors denying work due to the lack of
accessibility
O Police matter, they are to be contacted for clarification
● North Street to reopen again
● Work in South Street to be finished soon, but is running over time and budget
Batchen Street is due for road works
Elgin Town Board
● ETB is to give the police £10,000
O Means more police in Elgin for as long as the funding lasts

○ Very low on the agenda
● All meetings have been in confidence except for 2
No minutes released since April 10th
○ Two sets have been put up on the MyMoray sites
The previous agendas were printed out so the members could see what kind of things the
Elgin Town Board talk about
 New Elgin Hub received funding from the Scottish Government
O Buckie Hub not happy
■ Did they ask for funding?
● Elgin Town Board want to clean the high street
○ The property owners won't let anyone near the trees on the roof
■ Does damage to the property if it gets removed
 Also does damage to the property if it remains
■ Risk of someone being injured of the trees remain
• Public liability, doesn't this affect their insurance?
■ Some of the owners don't live in Elgin
Elgin bid had contacted the owners
O A lot of the properties are sublet
Gulls
 Nature Scot has a process that can be followed to get the issue sorted
O Nature Scot has been here before, agreeing that it was an issue before back
tracking
O Lost contact

 Sonic devices felt like they had made a massive difference
O Drones and hawks were also used to try to deter them
○ As soon as they were switched off, they all came back
■ Increase of gulls in the whole of Moray
○ Their purpose is to prevent nesting
O Last year there was a decrease and this year there was an even further
decrease
O It takes 5 years to break a nesting pattern
■ They are nesting until the end of July
■ Nesting habits have changed already
● They're not laying they last 1-2 eggs until later
• Nature Scot say if the proper deterrents are carried out and are not effective, you can
get a licence
O It is so very difficult to get a licence
 Pest controllers are having meetings with Nature Scot
○ The licence for nest removal for an individual house is £70
• Numbers were in decline in their natural habitat but have risen in urban areas
This is a country wide issue
● There are much less young gulls compared to two years ago
● The numbers in Forres and Buckie have potentially doubled
Write to the Minister of Agriculture
○ Graham to contact them

Elected Members
● There was a meeting at Bishopmill Primary School about schools in the local area
● Elgin, Forres and Buckie school capacities are very full
● Affordable housing paper was pulled due to the election period
○ Will come back in September time
● Extra community warden was approved
O Already had two but used to have 8
■ Some were made redundant
● The byelection in Elgin South must happen in the next 8-12 weeks
ACOB
● Eight Acres Update
O Must be under same ownership
O It is a commercial decision as to whether it will open again
O Moray is getting a third of a million pounds
■ Meeting for engagement to happen soon
