Business:

MR provided background information on the windfarm and power line proposals.

Overhead Power Lines - there are 2 sets.

1) From Rothes III windfarm to Blackhillock Substation. This will pass to the north of Rothes and will consist of large wooden poles. No decision has yet been made. Highland Distillers have objected. Further information can be found on the Energy Consents Unit website under ECU 00004733.

2) Beauly to Blackhillock etc transmission reinforcement. Currently a pre-application consultation requesting a Scoping Opinion. There will be pylons with an average height of 57m plus the overhead power lines.

Windfarms with battery storage – 2 proposed developments.

1) Teindland Forest Windfarm. A Scoping Opinion has already been issued by the Energy Consents Unit. 17 turbines with a maximum height of 230m (756ft) together with battery storage. Onsite tracks and onsite substation.

2) Blackhills Windfarm. A windfarm on Brown Muir was refused by Scottish Ministers in 2015. This proposal is in almost the same location but with taller turbines (200m/656ft) together with battery storage.

ECU 00005136

These two windfarms are adjacent to each other.

The meeting was then opened up for discussion and concluded with a decision by those present to form a pressure group, independent of Speyside Community Council, to further discuss and act on the above proposals.
