Minute of August Meeting

2 Police Scotland

• No response

3 Elgin Town Board

- Been up and running for 12 weeks so far
- Started in April
- They now meet on a monthly basis
- $\pounds 20$ million to be given over a 10 year period
- They had 12 weeks to a create plan
- \circ Every idea had to all into one of three categories:
- Safety and security
- Town centre regeneration
- Transport and connectivity
- The plan has already been submitted
- They have a detailed plan compared to others
- Most of the plan is now online at the MyMoray website
- \circ Hope to provide whole plan soon
- -It was a community driven plan
- Over 500 people in participated in the engagement
- 380 responses on online survey
- over 1000 comments

- There were lots of different ways for the community to engage
- The Youth were a big target for this
- 20% out of the 500 participants were young people
- Community priorities included
- Tidying up the town centre
- Concern over St Giles
- Café culture
- Pedestrianisation vs cars
- Cooper park
- Athletic track
- Not just for Elgin but for Moray
- \circ More police/CCTV
- Antisocial behaviour
- Money has been allocated to Cooper park
- New play area
- Pump Truck
- New pavillion
- Money has been put aside for the St Giles Centre
- Vaccination/outpatient centre for the NHS
- Money for the new Elgin Hub
- For rent/staff
- Hot spot policing
- Youth provision
- \circ Youth bus to engage with young people
- Should be up running in October
- Stagecoach donated a bus and a driver
- Youth bus not something that will have to be shared with the rest of Moray
- However there might be pressure to force it outside of Elgin
- Have reacted to what the community needs
- Looking to have more discussion on a town tidy up
- Capital Grant Scheme for business upkeep
- They are committed to projects beyond the allotted three years
- Aiming for a fully accessible play area in Cooper park

- Also want to improve lighting and CCTV in Cooper park
- Speaking to design agent to get a refresh for Elgin
- Taken inspiration from the Elgin Cathedral Architecture)
- A brilliant example of how people want to be involved
- It was a philanthropic gift that was donated
- Want three cameras
- Two in Cooper park
- One on Elgin Town Hall roof facing the car park
- The purpose of board is to facilitate the £20 million

• Antisocial behaviour will be the first issue tackled in the first year and is the main priority

- Waiting for feedback from the Government before releasing feedback plan
- Elgin bid have purchased a Street cleaner
- Elgin fountain doesn't work due to the size of the pump
- \circ No change of water increases the risk of legionnaire's disease
- It is difficult to give updates due to the confidentiality surrounding it

- Can have up to 18 members
- There can be as many associate members as we like
- Banners outside Elgin Town Hall could make it possible to let the community know that we meet every month
- No place set yet for when the Elgin Town Hall closes
- 7 Finance
- £5,3541
- £99.99 was spent
- New amount: £5241.01

- Request from elgin allotment group
- \circ Their account has been closed by the bank
- Sub account has been open
- They are expected to manage their own books

8 Parking

• Further £10,000 to go to the police to keep the momentum

• Bollards to stop people driving across the plain stones and Batchen Street from the growth fund

- Asking for better signage for Batchen Street and the plain stones
- Police say there is an improvement but there are serial offenders
- 758 issued over all until the end of July
- General parking has improved
- Only 138 tickets issued of for the whole of last year
- People don't want to pay the £2 for the TK maxx so park at the retail park for free
- Aldi to be moving to the retail park
- Creates less incentive to park in the town car parks
- 9 Gulls
- No help from nature Scot
- They aren't helping anyone on this issue
- Put a letter to Holyrood
- Suggested that a petition is levied
- \circ Brian to contact other community councils outside of Moray to see if we can get more on board
- Support from businesses?
- See if Nature Scot can do a recount on the number of gulls by the Government
- \circ The current data is seen to be outdated
- Gulls are still a protected species
- Gulls are affecting the other birds
- Even if we could do anything extra, the mass egg and nest removal can only happen on council houses

- Can't force private property owners to do anything
- Deterrents only move the gull to somewhere else
- Sonic devices used to deter nesting
- Sonic devices are working
- It will be about five or six years until we see a significant decrease

 \circ Was warned that when the devices got turned off, there would be an increase in seagulls

- Kites should not be up for more than 30 minutes at a time
- They can become use to them
- No numbers this year for the eggs yet
- Councillors are doing as much as they can
- Up to the government to get it sorted
- Could a cull be possible?

11 Planning

- New Cemetery was agreed to
- Open meeting for the Aldi being relocated
- Could affect Bishopmill people who can't drive negatively

12 • Budget

• £1.3 million in deficit

 \circ A lot of medical equipment and spending goes to Aberdeen

13 Community Council Funding

- Needs to be a more fair dividing of funding
- \circ Meeting takes place on the 21st August
- There needs to be complete agreement before any changes can be enacted

14 Resilience

• Need to review funding for the new plan

- Hope to keep funding
- Flooding issue with outfall pipe is still not sorted
- Flooding engineers don't see the overgrowth behind Johnstons as a problem
- \circ There is a path for for water to flow
- Sediment is not at risk of flooding
- All drains cleaned annually
- Should be done twice a year
- There is a pumping station at Asda controlled by Scottish water
- \circ There is also a small pumping station at Lidl

15 NHS Grampian

- Nothing back
- Brian to chase them up again to follow up the March meeting

16 Elected Members Update

- 2 years left for the old cemetery
- New cemetery should last around 150 years
- Bi election on the 7th November
- Count on 8th November
