1.	Welcome, and apologies:

3.	Public Session	
	Forres Railway Station – SF advised he has written to Scotrail's Director of Public Relations but has not received a response yet. GM advised he had spoken with Scotrail and they stated that the displays would be getting updated within the next couple of weeks. A member of the Explorer Scouts who advised SF that they stay on the other side of town and when they get back into town they sometimes need go to the toilet but, the toilets are in the locked up waiting area and there is no access to one from the outside, and the building s only manned for a couple of hours a day. 5.	Matters Arising	
	Outdoor Gym – SF spoke to the Insurance provider and was finding out about Third Party Liability Insurance. The Insurers advised that whoever conducts the safety checks of the equipment the liability lies with them, this would be Moray Council. SF wrote to the Council to let them know that as they conduct the safety checks of the equipment the third-party liability comes under their insurance policy.	
	Town Maps – It was brought up if there was any update about who owns the town maps that are situated around the Town. KR asked what maps we were talking about so SF advised where the maps were, and we are looking to update the maps and allow businesses could advertise for a fee which would make the maps self-funding which can then be used to maintain the maps. KR advised she will chase this up to find out who owns them.	
	Resilience – SF advised that he had now got the radios and is needing their distance testing.	
6.	Planning/Licences	
	Planning - There are no_planning concerns that have come through. SF asked if anyone was aware of what is happening with the old dry cleaners on Gordon Street, but no one was able to advise.	SF
7.f.	Action Plan Updates	
	Resilience – SF advised himself and Paul attended a meeting to discuss what they are doing, and the Council is gong to produce seasonal posters with information on things to do and not do (e.g. going away in the winter, so turn radiators to low so pipes don't burst) posters will be put up around town.	
	Local Place Plan – This is nearing completion, and SF was at a meeting while all documents are correct and completed correctly. The place plan is due to be submitted by the end of November. SF advised that thanks to both Tina Coffey and Sandra MacLennan who have gathered and collated all the necessary documentation for the place plan.	
	Community Council Review Scheme – SF advised we need to submit a response if there are any changes that we might want to change. It was discussed about how members should we have as a minimum number to make a quorum. It was decided that our quorum should be four. KSk mentioned that the work that the Community Council and Forres Area Forum are both doing the same things, KR advised that they are 2 separate groups, and the Government stipulated that all local authorities should have a Community Council which is a mandated group, and the forum is for the Forres Area, so it takes in the other Community Councils. KSk asked that someone from FCC should attend FAF and report back to both meetings and	ALL

	update both. It was advised that the Council are preparing a paper on how the Forum should be run, this is due to a lot of duplication.	
8.	Correspondence4	
	There have been no concerns in the correspondence received.	SF
9.	Treasurer's Report	
	The Treasurer reported that there was £6,370.33, there has been expenses and honorarium paid out since our last meeting.	GM
10.	Moray councillor reports	
	CIIr Kathleen Robertson – KR advised that the councillors have had a meeting regarding the Common Good Fund but are having to look further into it as it would appear there has not been a consistent approach with the funds, so we will have to wait for a further update. The Roysvale football ground is being borrowed for 3 years while the new Academy building is being built in the playing field area of Apple grove Primary School and the only other land that is going to be used is a stretch of Sanquhar Road to enable the buses to have a drop off and pick up area. KR wished to acknowledge the demanding work done over the years by Hunter Duncan who sadly passed away recently. KR advised that the times for Remembrance Sunday service and wreath laying in Forres have changed to 11am wreath laying and the service will be held at 9.45am in St Leonards Church. A survey has been launched with regards to the upcoming budget and it will help the Councils better on what services residents prioritise etc, so all views and feedback appreciated, and there is a drop-in session being held in Elgin. KR told us about a trip she took to Shetland to attend an event with other councils and MSPs where ministers were lobbied on various aspects. KR stated that there is a working group set up to look at the council's policy on mobile phone usage in school, and so a consistent standard is set to go across all schools in Moray.	
	CIIr Paul McBain – PM advised while on recess he was in Canada visiting family and he had the opportunity to speak to local educators and he asked about what if any changes in discipline did they face especially with mobile phone usage and he heard that they found no difference between any of the local schools out there. PM stated that the use of the Common Good Funds that it needs to be opened to more groups/people.	
	CIIr Scott Lawrence – SL advised that he had attended the latest Parent Partnership which is held in the Academy and the main issue was the use of mobile phones, most schools have their own policy but with Moray only having eight secondary schools so to have policy across the area. SL mentioned that the Councillors alongside the housing department carried out a walkabout of the town and the properties that the Council hold and working to establish homes that	

	require new kitchen/bathroom etc, those that are not economically viable and those properties that could be purchased back by the council and repurposed.
