Library Closures: Just been announced that there is a high possibility that 7 libraries in Moray may be closed. This is still to be discussed by Moray Council councillors A meeting was organised in the community centre which was well attended by families' organisations who use the library. Petitions are being distributed around Lossiemouth and LCC have written to all our representatives MP/MSP/Councillors /Moray council objecting to these closures. Everyone encouraged to complete the survey online and contact their local councillors MSP/MP
