4. St Giles Centre  5. Seagulls	There has been widespread condemnation at the shock decision to close the St Giles Centre with only 2 weeks' notice, which some have stated as being illegal. The owner who accrued unpaid commercial rates in the region of £750.000, has argued about rates on empty units which are still liable. A number of the businesses are hoping to relocate, others will close indefinitely. External agencies are working to alleviate job losses.  There has been little investment in the St G C for a number of years, faulty lifts, escalators and leaking roof to name but a few areas of concern,  The bus station which is leased will remain in situ until an alternative site can be found.  The response our Cllr's received from Nature Scot to their	
o. oduguno	plea for licence changes is both shocking and insulting to the Cllr's and the general public. (can be viewed on MC website)  The general feeling is that Nature Scot is not fit for purpose, and it was noted that they have had their budget cut by the Scottish Government.  Locally – we know the data on gull numbers is out of date. The breeding 'season' is out of sync and no longer confined to a couple of months. The behaviour of the birds is noticeably changing, whereby they are swooping for food all the time and not just when breeding.

Town Hall, Community Centre	Elgin Town Hall closure has been delayed for a couple of months, and a licence application has been submitted for the Community Centre which is to become a temporary home to the town hall during the renovations to the existing building. Many are angry at this due to groups being forced out of the community centre which was deemed as not fit for purpose.
