Vermin control	Emma has joined us to explain her role with S.V.C and in	
	particular seagulls. She has been carrying out gull work on	
	behalf of Moray Council / Elgin BID for 5 years and is	
	instantly recognised by the gulls when she appears on site.	
	Emma said she was not surprised at our poor responses	
	from Nature Scot (NS) and explained that S.V.C are equally	
	frustrated by this. The application for a licence to deal with	
	gulls takes over an hour to complete and only one in eight	
	applications are successful. Gull take 7 years to reach	
	maturity, but the young gulls stay close by the parent birds	
	forming colonies, and once a nest has eggs within it is	
	difficult to gain any licence to deal with this nor any of the	
	birds. Bird poop carries many diseases, and bird aggression	

	is put down to their diet which is very different to that which	
	they would have if at sea.	
	If more people raise issue regarding gulls with NS then it may	
	provoke change as to how they operate and grant	
	permissions.
