	to Aberdeen is zero as it is perceived that as a city council	
	there will be less green waste to dispose of, and local	
	authorities have a duty to uplift food waste.	
	It was also noted that some people in Moray believe that a	
	permit is required to have the brown bins emptied, hence	
	why food waste is ending up in the green bins.	
	Brian mentioned that Pat Munro hire have dredged part of	
	the Tyock burn however they have encountered a problem	
	which needs to be resolved before they can complete the	
	work.
