

MORAY & NAIRN EDUCATIONAL TRUST SCHEME 1935

CONDITIONS OF AWARD OF GRANT

- 1. Moray Council has powers to make grants for various purposes, details of which are given below in section 4.
- 2. Grants can normally be made only to:
 - persons resident in the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire,
 - school pupils or young persons attending schools or further education centres in the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire,
 - school pupils, whose parents are resident in the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire,
 - schools and further education centres in the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire, and
 - clubs and organisations operating for the benefit of persons belonging to the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire
- 3. In making grants for any purpose, financial circumstances will be taken into account and household income should not exceed £34,000 per year. Applicants must be ordinarily resident in the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire for the 3 years immediately prior to the start date of course or activity. The closing date for applications each year will be 30 September.
- 4. Details of purposes for which grants may be made under the various sections of the Trust Scheme:-

Simpson Bursary

The Simpson Bursary Fund was bequeathed by the late Dr Donald Simpson of Fern Tree Valley, Victoria, Australia. Bursaries may be made to individuals ordinarily resident in the former County of Morayshire and the parishes of Duthil and Abernethy. The area covers Moray to the West of the River Spey, Fochabers, Grantown-on-Spey, Nethy Bridge, Aviemore, Boat of Garten and Carrbridge.

Section 3: Annual Student Grants

Grants may be made to individuals in the former combined County of Morayshire and Nairnshire studying further education, higher education or post-graduate education courses.

Section 4: Adult Education

Grants may be made to support the delivery of adult education lectures or other suitable forms of instruction in the former combined County of Moray and Nairnshire.

Section 5: Special Equipment

Grants may be made to schools to assist in providing special equipment in supplement to that which the Education Authority might reasonably be expected to supply.

Section 6: Sports Facilities

Grants may be made to assist in providing and maintaining playing fields and other sports facilities for the benefit of children and young people resident in the former combined County of Moray and Nairn.

Section 7a: School Excursions – Grants to Schools

Grants may be made to schools to undertake educational excursions.

<u>Section 7b: School Excursions – Grants to Individuals</u>
Grants may be made for an individual young person (school age) to participate in educational school excursions.
