Save Money

Follow the following advice to find out what savings you can make:

- 1** Boil only the amount of water you need in the Kettle. Using the correct amount saves around £5 a year. £5
- 2** Hang washing out to dry when you can. Not using a tumble dryer in summer saves around £35 a year. £35
- 3** Turn the heating thermostat down one degree and save 10% on your fuel bill (based on a three bedroomed semi) Saves around £29 a year. £29
- 4** Close the curtains at dusk to keep the heat in. Saves around £15 a year. £15
- 5** Fit low energy light bulbs where possible. Four low energy light bulbs on 5 hours a day saves around £23 a year. £23
- 6** Take a shower rather than a bath – a shower uses half the hot water of a bath. Saves around £10 a year per person. £10
- 7** Turn off taps properly - dripping hot tap will fill a bath in one day. Saves around £5 a year. £5
- 8** Put the plug in the sink – leaving the hot water taps running without the plug is wasteful. Saves around £15 a year. £15
- 9** Set the hot water cylinder to 60 degrees C – water shouldn't be heated to a scalding temperature. Saves around £15 a year. £15
- 10** Insulate your hot water cylinder – only costs about £10 and will save more than £10 a year. £10

Total saving : £162 a year
