- Access to quality assessment and advice about the full range of language and communication choices.
- To ensure quality technological support to promote independent communication and learning.
- To foster understanding and value of deaf culture in all establishments where deaf pupils are educated.

# What does the Hearing Education Service provide?

- Qualified Teachers of the Deaf and Communication Assistants trained in BSL
- Specialist teaching; a wide range of learning and teaching approaches
- Deaf awareness and in-service training for class teachers and support staff
- Advice and support for class teachers
- Advice and support to pupils and their peers
- Provision and support in the use of radio aids and listening devices
- Training in the use of and checking equipment.
- Home visits for pre-school children
- Links to other agencies
- Monitor pupils ongoing amplification needs
