## • What is it?

- a long-awaited replacement school due to start construction in Spring 2014
- to accommodate around 750 pupils
- Total Cost approx £17.5 M
- Two thirds funded by Scottish Futures Trust, One Third by The Moray Council
- Handover by Summer Term 2015
- Kestrel House (SEN provision) to be retained
- Enhanced community facilities to be provided

## • Who is paying for it?

- The Scottish Futures Trust (SFT) and The Moray Council
- SFT is an independent company, established by the Scottish Government in 2008, with a responsibility for delivering value for money across all public sector infrastructure investment.
- SFT operates at arm's length from the Government but works closely with the public sector to seek and deliver improved value for taxpayers
