1.	AGENCY UPDATES	
a.	POLICE SCOTLAND – Darren Ross	
	PC Ross reported there had been 130 crimes / offences dealt with in Elgin during the last month. 26 assaults of which 7 were domestic, 2 serious and 1 within licensed premises. There were no housebreakings but there was one theft of a motor vehicle, 16 general thefts and 16 thefts by shoplifting. There were 9 breach of the peace. There was one drunk driver and 2 speeders.	
	Councillor Reid asked if police were aware of dogs being stolen in Elgin. PC Ross was unaware.	
	Eddie Wallace commented on the police now actively policing parking in the area around Elgin High Street and South Street. Alastair Kennedy said this was very welcome as it was something the community council and especially Gordon Methven had been requesting more of since the traffic warden service had been removed.	
	Anne Glover asked about disabled drivers parking at the top of North Street blocking the entrance to the pedestrian area on High Street. PC Ross advised most disabled drivers would be educated for such offences but if the obstruction was blatant a fixed penalty could be issued.	
	Alastair Kennedy thanked PC Ross for the input and he then left the meeting.	
b.	STAGECOACH - Krystian Kaczala	
	Krystian explained there had been fare increases in most areas but that fares were to remain the same in Moray. From 20 th April there will be a new timetable for services 10, 31 and 35 to provide a bus every 15 minutes. Stagecoach are introducing AVL (Automatic Vehicle Location) which sends a signal from the bus every 20 seconds to control. This will enable controllers to monitor delays etc and communicate with drivers via a text display on their ticket machine which will only operate when the vehicle is stationary and the handbrake on. The controllers will see a display which shows the vehicles as red if they are too early, green if they are on time and blue if the buses are late. It will take time for staff to get used to the system which should be installed by the end of May / beginning of June. It will provide Krystian with the ability to analyse data more effectively.	
	Alastair Kennedy asked if this will allow problems to be dealt with earlier and Krystian said it should help.	
	Pat Paterson asked about the digital display at the bus station. Krystian advised this was actually maintained by Moray Council but he was hopeful the information from AVL will be available to be displayed on that also. If so it would help the situation there.	
	Alastair Kennedy advised that Hitrans were distributing leaflets about cards for disabled people who need assistance that they could show to drivers. Krystian said he was aware and was enthusiastic about this.	
	A discussion followed about how best to get the information out and where people could get these cards. Krystian is to follow up and send us more information. Eddie Wallace said he would also investigate.	
	David Chapman asked if drivers were allowed to assist disabled people in boarding or alighting from the vehicle. Krystian said the driveers were encouraged to help unless they had a medical condition themselves which prevented them from doing so.	
	Anne Glover highlighted aa situation reported to her where a wheelchair user had booked the space on a bus for her use only to find the space blocked by prams when she tried to board. Krystian said that when such information is passed to them drivers are issued with a note so they can ensure the space is available. He didn't know what had happened on that particular occasion. He further advised that there had been different views issued by the courts as to who is responsible to ensure space is available. One court reasoned it was impractical to expect a bus company to enforce space is kept clear of prams if parents ignored the driver whilst another reasoned it was the bus companies responsibility.	
	Eddie Wallace asked how much of Scotland will be covered by AVL. Krystian said it was planned to hopefully role out AVL to the whole of Scotland depending upon the coverage in certain areas.	
	Donnie Maclean commented he had received a complaint from a lady who said there always seems to be breakdowns on route 36. Krystian disputed this and advised there had been one breakdown last week but their stats showed there to be only around 0.05% breakdowns. The buses are checked every 21 days for defects. He will bring the information with him next time he attends a meeting.	
	Alastair Kennedy thanked Krystian for the input and he then left the meeting.
